The Bradenton Area Development Corporation responded to 104 project leads from October 1, 2012 to September 30, 2013, in addition to general inquiries and information requests.

This includes assisting businesses with:

- **Customized Assistance**

- ◆ **Site selection** – A real estate database is maintained on the Bradenton Area Economic Development Corporation's website. Real estate searches and site tours are conducted as requested by prospect companies.
- ◆ **Permitting and licensing** – The Bradenton Area Economic Development Corporation, in collaboration with the Manatee County Government Economic Development Manager qualified 7 new rapid response projects.

- ◆ **Incentives**—The Bradenton Area Economic Development Corporation provides companies with the appropriate state and/or local incentive information based on the type of project, targeted industry, job creation, projected wages, and capital investment. The Bradenton Area Economic Development Corporation collaborates with the local or state governing body to expedite the incentive application process.
- **General Assistance**
 - ◆ **Demographics and market research** –The Bradenton Area Economic Development Corporation provides demographic information and market research about Manatee County, as requested.
 - ◆ **Workforce assistance** – The Bradenton Area Economic Development Corporation met with over 50 local companies to discuss their workforce needs during this time period. The Bradenton Area Economic Development Corporation connect companies with workforce partner for hiring and training opportunities, as well as coordinating one on one time with instructors in order to provide input towards training programs. The Bradenton Area Economic Development Corporation promotes employment websites such as Employ Florida, Workforce Florida and Suncoast Workforce.
 - ◆ **Forums and workshops – finance/international trade/technology transfer**
The Bradenton Area Economic Development Corporation regularly hosts, sponsors and promotes business forums and workshops tailored to the needs of local businesses, including (but not limited to) finance seminars, international trade, global logistics and export readiness, lean manufacturing, marketing, small business innovation research (SBIR) grant seminars, GrowFL CEO Nexus Forums and entrepreneurial events.
- **Financial Assistance**
 - ◆ **Grants and matching funds assistance** – The Bradenton Area Economic Development Corporation assisted Manatee County companies with the application and approval process for the following state and federal workforce grant funding:

▪ Employed Worker Training Grants	\$ 6,150
▪ Incumbent Worker Training Grants	\$ 88,970
▪ Quick Response Training Grants	\$ 557,006
▪ On the Job Training placements	59 people
- **The projected number of new direct jobs as a result of a business being moved into the area or expanding in the area due to the assistance of the EDO.** The Bradenton Area Economic Development Corporation assisted 10 companies with a combined projected job creation total of 337 jobs over the next three to five years.
- **The number of these jobs retained.** The Bradenton Area Economic Development Corporation assisted 8 local company expansions, aiding in the retention of 228 jobs in the Manatee-Sarasota region during fiscal year.
